One of the most inaccurate stereotypes about seniors is that their best work is behind them. We know this because of the hundreds of senior volunteers we see positively impacting our community daily!

Seniors need what we all need, love and work, a sense of connection, bonds that matter deeply, and a reason to get up in the morning.

But for so many decades, seniors have been consigned to a world that's both isolated and cut off from that sense of purpose. Many feel invisible. Society has consciously and systematically separated people by age where we have relatively little contact with one another. It's time to make a change!

At Seniors in Service, multiple generations work together on our staff and as volunteers in our community. We know that bringing generations together is mutually beneficial and creates a greater sense of joy. That's why we believe it's so important to develop opportunities for senior generations and let old, young, and all the people in the middle mix in the context of daily life.

Rachel, one of our college-aged Health Buddies volunteers, learned her client Agnes was struggling to eat solid foods while she waited to receive new dentures. Rachel recently had braces and remembered how her teeth ached! Rachel shared with Agnes how her mom blended her proteins, like chicken, with barbeque sauce to make it "sloppy joe" style. Agnes gave it a try and was thrilled to enjoy solid foods again. Now she's excited to cook!

Even though Rachel had not dealt with this common generational issue herself, she was still able to pull from a relevant experience. Oftentimes you might not think someone from a different generation may be able to relate to you or understand you, but we're here to tell you they can.

I encourage you to break down age-related barriers in your own life and seek out opportunities to engage with people from different generations. Keith Smith Wins Volunteer of the Year!



Each year Volunteer Florida selects a Florida AmeriCorps member who best exemplifies national service to honor as the Volunteer of the Year. In April, our very own Keith Smith, an Operation: Veteran Connect member, received this award for his exceptional service. Mr. Smith is a Vietnam veteran whose name may be ordinary, but his service to his fellow veteran brothers and sisters is anything but.

As he sits high in his sturdy pickup with a long trailer, he navigates through the busy Tampa traffic with the expert skill from his military service. His mission? To deliver precious cargo to veterans leaving temporary housing at New Beginnings and help them transition to their own apartments. Mr. Smith delivers donated beds, sofas, chairs, and tables to create a home and give hope that living independently again is possible.

When Mr. Smith discovered that veterans needed bicycles for transportation to get to work, he immediately sprang into action. He set up a bicycle repair garage, rekindling skills from his youth, and collecting donated bikes throughout the community to repair and put back into use.

For Mr. Smith, the significance of this award went beyond mere recognition. It represented long-awaited appreciation for his service and the welcome home he deserved. Upon receiving the award, Mr. Smith shared:

“While a few of you may know some of the things we as servicemen experienced during and after returning home from Vietnam, I now realize that most of you don’t. We can’t unsee what we’ve seen. We can’t put into words what we’ve heard, and it’s all burnt into our minds with the emotions we felt at the time. I say that because of all the things I have experienced since my time in the service, nothing has made me feel welcomed home until receiving your award today. Tonight, I feel proud to be an American, I feel blessed to have been able to serve my fellow countrymen and especially the Veterans we serve and the staff we work with. In my heart I know there is no other organization that does so much good to help us all become better Americans.”

Mr. Smith shows the power of extraordinary service, helping one veteran at a time create a living space they can call home. His dedication and commitment to his fellow veterans make him a deserving recipient for Volunteer of the Year.

St. Pete Inducts Classroom Grandparent Barbara Burnett Into Senior Hall of Fame



Congratulations to our very own Barbara Burnett, a Foster Grandparent Program volunteer, for being inducted into the St. Pete Senior Hall of Fame! Each year the Senior Hall of Fame honors a select group of St. Petersburg volunteers for their significant contributions toward enriching the quality of life for others. Those chosen for induction are role models for leading meaningful, vibrant lives, and their compelling stories demonstrate their commitment to causes, organizations, and to the community at large.

Barbara Burnett, or “Grandma B” as her students lovingly call her, is an active and influential member of the St. Pete community. In 2017 Grandma B joined Seniors in Service as a Foster Grandma where she actively volunteers in the classroom, serving over 60 hours every month. Grandma B tutors students who are struggling to learn the alphabet and hold a pencil. She takes the time to go back to the basics and correct each step along the way. Grandma B provides hands-on assistance to students at risk of being held back and watches them grow and excel.

Grandma B’s love for serving others extends beyond the classroom and radiates kindness throughout St. Petersburg. Since 2005 she has volunteered at over 10 organizations impacting the lives of everyone she meets. In the past 18 years, she has created lifelong relationships with the youth of her community. With two years of bible college and a Master’s in Human Services, she uses her skills to foster social connection, mentor children, educate on health topics, and spread her passion for literacy.

The legacy of the Senior Hall of Fame is to preserve and foster an appreciation for these remarkable individuals, and there isn’t a more deserving volunteer. Grandma B is a symbol of consistency in the lives of St. Pete children, where her devotion to mentoring is nothing short of glorious. Barbara Burnett has forever changed the lives of St. Pete residents by being a leader in her church, a wellness advocate, a literacy champion, and a resource for every neighbor. When you cross paths with Grandma B, you have a friend for life.

Presenting Health Buddies: “Companionship as Medicine”!

Seniors in Service Program Coordinator, Aria Garling, had the privilege of presenting our innovative Health Buddies program at the 2023 Florida Blue Foundation Community Health Symposium. Presenters at the symposium included national, regional, and Florida-based experts on a variety of issues affecting health, communities, and health care policy. This year’s symposium focused on the topic of mental well-being.



Health Buddies improves mental well-being for isolated seniors living with chronic conditions by pairing them with a Health Buddy. Health Buddies are caring, trained volunteers who provide companionship, health knowledge and encouragement. Participant data indicates that by the end of the 12-week Health Buddies intervention, clients reported decreased feelings of nervousness, depression, hopelessness, worthlessness, and restlessness plus improved ability to self-manage their health. 98% of Health Buddy clients did not visit the emergency room!

We were honored to have the opportunity to share with other health-minded symposium attendees how Health Buddies is improving mental wellbeing for Tampa Bay’s most vulnerable seniors by providing “companionship as medicine”.

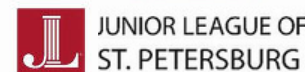
Community Foundation Tampa Bay Lifts Up Students Beyond the Classroom
