This year brought exciting growth across Seniors in Service, creating new ways to engage volunteers and more opportunities to help seniors, veterans, children, and families thrive.

Celebrating a Breakthrough Year for Our Literacy Programs!

This year, we welcomed 109 new Classroom Grandparents and expanded into 15 new schools across Hillsborough and Pinellas Counties. With more volunteers, more classrooms, and more family engagement, we're helping more students build confidence, strengthen reading skills, and feel supported every day.

Our Readers in Motion program—trusted for more than a decade to engage entire families through at-home reading challenges and hands-on STEM activities—has now expanded from Tampa into high-need schools in St. Petersburg, bringing the same education and family support to even more children.



Delivering Healthy Food with a Powerful Side of Social Connection

Health Buddies and Operation: Veteran Connect launched a new service this year to deliver fresh produce to seniors with chronic conditions and isolated veterans living in poverty. Each food delivery comes with friendly conversation, encouragement, and cooking tips. For those managing chronic illness or limited resources, these deliveries provide more than food—they offer nourishment, skill-building, and a pathway to better health.

New Companion Transportation Program Brings Relief and Rides to Seniors

We have so many passengers who cry,” shared Program Coordinator Michelle Mason about our new Companion Transportation Program in Southshore. “These are tears of joy and relief.”

This program fills a vital need for older adults in South Hillsborough County who struggle to reach routine and life-saving medical care. Our team of 11 compassionate volunteers does far more than drive. They ease anxiety, offer companionship, take notes during appointments if needed, and help connect seniors to services that promote healing.

Thanks to the generosity of Community Foundation Tampa Bay and AdventHealth, we launched this program in June 2025 with a goal of providing more than 500 rides in the first year—ensuring seniors feel supported every step of the way.



Launched Senior Disaster Support to Build Resilience Before the Storm

We’ve transformed the way 575+ older adults face disasters. Too often, seniors weather floodwaters, powerless apartments, and long, sleepless nights completely alone. Senior Disaster Support is changing that.

Built on the simple belief that strong community connections build resilience, we began by creating neighbor-to-neighbor networks in eight senior communities hit hardest by recent hurricanes. Our relationship-centered disaster support program offers monthly activities that foster trust, build camaraderie, and provide vital guidance on evacuation planning, home safety, emergency alert technology, and recovery strategies.

By helping neighbors truly know and rely on one another, we’re creating something storms can’t wash away: a community grounded in care and connection.

On the Move: Our Outreach Van and Trailer are Helping Us Reach New Heights of Service

We proudly launched our brand-new mobile outreach van and trailer, made possible through the generous support of the Juvenile Welfare Board of Pinellas County.

Their investment is making a difference by bringing disaster support resources directly to seniors, delivering books and educational supplies to children and families, and connecting isolated veterans—some of whom haven’t left their neighborhoods in years—to new experiences and opportunities for engagement. By taking our services on the road, we’re breaking down barriers and reaching seniors, veterans, and families in new and meaningful ways.



Our Tampa Office Got a Face-Lift

Our office is now a safe, welcoming space where volunteers can gather, learn, and share their passion for service. This year’s renovation added a new deck and canopy, a storage shed, fresh flooring, brighter lighting, and improved landscaping.

Every Statistic Has a Story!

The numbers show our reach, but the stories show our heart. Here are just a few of the volunteers who chose to show up and care—and the people whose lives were transformed by their compassion.



“God must really love me to send me a grandma like Ms. Myrna. I just simply love her,” shared Mrs. Litz, an elementary school teacher in Hillsborough County. Grandma Myrna’s support goes far beyond academics—she’s a comforting, steady presence who makes even the hardest days brighter. When Mrs. Litz was diagnosed with cancer, Grandma Myrna encouraged her through every step of treatment, offering support, comfort, and even homemade remedies. Mrs. Litz lovingly calls her “a celebrity in the classroom.” Students greet her with pure excitement each morning.



For years, Paul, a proud veteran, faced one setback after another, and without a Social Security card or Alien Resident card, he couldn’t receive benefits or find work. Those missing documents kept him stuck, no matter how hard he tried. Then he met our Operation: Veteran Connect volunteers.

Together, they worked to remove this barrier, and today, Paul finally holds both cards in his hands and is ready to start his new job. As he put it, **“Seniors in Service gave me the ‘A’ team—and they got it done!”**



Carmen is a Senior Companion with a gift for listening—and for drawing. Each time she visits a homebound senior, she brings her sketchbook. As they share memories and pieces of their lives, Carmen quietly captures their stories in gentle sketches. Her visits give seniors the chance to see their cherished memories honored and beautifully remembered.



Nancy needed a 100-mile round ride for a treatment that involved anesthesia. She shared, “I couldn’t have done this without the Companion Transportation volunteers. **Knowing someone cared enough to take me all that way, it meant everything.**”

When Joan joined Health Buddies, she’d visited the ER 10 times in 3 months. At first, she was hesitant to talk to her Health Buddy, Ella, saying, “Young people don’t always understand what it’s like to live like this.” But as Ella consistently called and truly listened, Joan opened up about her struggles with food insecurity and connected with resources she hadn’t known existed. “There were days when I didn’t know what I would eat. Now, I have help and a new friend,” she shared.

After 12 weeks, Joan had only gone to the ER twice—and her mental health improved dramatically, showing how compassionate connection can transform a person’s well-being.



Margie and Ron are indispensable members of the volunteer team at Florida Food Force in Pasco County. Week after week, they help provide hundreds of families with nutritious meals, making a tangible difference in the lives of those struggling to put food on the table.

Shirley volunteers each week at ECHO’s Resource Center in Brandon, helping struggling families find the clothing they need to feel confident and dignified as they work to rebuild their lives. Her dedication brings comfort, hope, and a sense of normalcy to those facing challenging times.
